



## **Dean of Students Position Opening The University of Texas at Dallas**

Reporting to the Vice President for Student Affairs (VPSA), the DOS provides leadership and supervision to the Dean of Students Office, including student conduct and conflict resolution, formulation and interpretation of University policies, disability services, fraternity and sorority life, student programming board, spirit programs, student government, student media, leadership, student organizations, major events such as academic integrity week, welcome week and homecoming and coordinates Student Affairs' participation in major student recruiting events. The DOS also provides coordination for Student Affairs crisis and critical incident management, including the Behavior Assessment and Intervention Team. Playing a key role on campus, the DOS serves as a member of the VPSA leadership team and collaborates with other campus departments to plan events. The DOS acts as the main liaison with other units of the University on individual student issues.

The successful candidate will have a minimum of a master's degree and eight years of progressive experience in Student Affairs, including judicial affairs, student conduct and crisis management. Preference will be given to those individuals with an earned doctorate in Student Affairs Administration or a related field and ten years of progressive experience.

The successful candidate must also demonstrate strong administrative and management competencies and the ability to work collaboratively with a variety of stakeholders, including faculty, staff, and students. The position requires a proven track record of exceptional leadership in Student Affairs and of strong collaborations and partnerships. The candidate must have experience in providing leadership in responding to critical incidents and in working with students, families, attorneys and other stakeholders in crisis situations.
